

FROM OUR PASTOR...

The Worship and Music Committee has begun regrouping. While we are still early in our discussions, we will draw on foundational practices relevant to our worship experiences. During one of our conversations, we discussed the exciting possibility of bringing back the healing services, possibly once per month. These services would allow worshippers to have an intimate moment of prayer, laying of hands, and anointing the head with oil.

Our discussions have led us to a profound question: "Why did early believers pour oil over their heads?" This question takes us back to the very origins of our faith. The use of oil holds a deeprooted place in our religious history, with over 210 mentions throughout the Bible. The earliest account of oil used in scripture dates back to Jacob, who rose early in the morning, took the stone under his head, set it up as a pillar, and poured oil on top of it (Gen. 28:18).

Oil has played a multifaceted role in our religious practices. It was used for anointing, a ritual that signified the consecration of an individual for a specific purpose. For instance, priests and kings were anointed with oil as a divine appointment. A notable example is when Moses was instructed to take oil and blood from the altar and sprinkle it on Aaron and his vestments, along with his sons' vestments, preparing them for the priestly service God was calling them to (Exodus 29:21). The anointing oil was also used to consecrate the tabernacle and all its furniture, making them holy (Ex. 40:9).

Oil was used as a burnt offering, creating a "pleasant odor to the Lord" (Lev. 6:21) and a part of the Israelites' diet. "But she said, as the Lord your God lives, I have no bread, only a handful of flour in the bowl and a little oil in the jar; and behold, I am gathering a few sticks that I may go in and prepare for me and my son so that we may eat." (1 Kings 17:12).

Oil was also used as a symbol of the Holy Spirit to illuminate, consecrate, heal, and comfort. "You have loved righteousness and hated wickedness; therefore, God, Your God, has anointed you with the oil of joy above your fellows" (Psa. 45:7). "The Spirit of the Lord God is upon me because the Lord has anointed me to bring good news to the afflicted; he has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to captives and freedom to prisoners (Isa. 61:1). "And came to him and bandaged up his wounds, pouring oil and wine on them; and he put him on his own beast, and brought him to an inn and took care of him (Luke 10:34).

During the Lutheran Reformation, Martin Luther emphasized God's grace through the Sacraments' importance. Each week, we come to hear the Good News of Jesus Christ proclaimed and to come to the table to be fed. We publically confess the sinful nature of being a human and mercifully ask God to wash us clean once again. We hold onto the promise that we are made clean through the saving act of Christ and the never-ending amount of grace poured over us.

We hear the words of institution during communion, reminding us that Christ died so we can be absolved of our sins and forgiven. We know this to be true because Christ promised this to us in our waters of baptism, where oil was placed on our heads, marking us with the cross of Christ forever and claiming us heirs of the Kingdom to come. (Matt. 6:12, John 14:16).

Oil serves as a tangible reminder that the Holy Spirit is always with us, healing and consecrating us as God's children. It has a rich history with God's people, serving as a visible sign of God's presence and grace. It connects us to biblical traditions, reminding us of the work of the Holy Spirit in our lives. As we continue to plan worship, oil will be a significant part of our worship practice, reminding us that we are all holy in the eyes of God.

Following welcoming remarks and the business meeting we were entertained by the Grace Lutheran Praise Team with songs and testimonies. We were blessed by the remarks from Nellie Beyan-Olabige of Omaha who grew up as a Lutheran in war-torn Liberia and received a LWR quilt that she said saved her life and comforted her through terrible civil war times. She is now a very prominent Omaha advocate and told us of ways we can help women struggling as she once was. The Grace WELCA group of 10 women meeting four times a month sent 100 quilts to LWR last year as well as many health, sewing, school and baby kits. Pastor Priscilla led us in a Bible Study, "Open Our Hearts-Listen, Be Kind, Pray", with a booklet that included a number of Bible verses pertaining to "Do not worry", "Humble yourself" and "God cares for you". We centered ourselves with a finger labyrinth before breaking for a delicious lunch. After lunch each table put together LWR baby care kits for a total of 18 kits. Pr. Priscilla shared slides of her January 2024 Nebraska Vision Trip to Tanzania. We could recognize several pastors and friends in the photos. The offering for the day was \$1,083.25 to be divided 60% for Churchwide Women's Organization, 20% Katie's Fund and 20% for the Nebraska Synodical Women's Organization (NSWO). A change in dates to August 2, 3, 4 was reported for the summer Saved to Serve project at Dana Village in Blair. The day closed with worship and communion. We were sent on our way with snacks and coffee after a very enlightening, uplifting day.
