

FROM OUR PASTOR...

Grace to you and peace from our Creator God and Lord Jesus Christ, amen.

"Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith, as you are being rooted and grounded in love." Ephesians 3:17

I want to express my deep gratitude to Doug and Mary Mohl, Kathy Becker, and Amber Labenz for their commitment and representation of Our Savior Lutheran Church at this year's Nebraska Synod. The Nebraska Synod Assembly, held in Kearney, Nebraska, from June 1 to 2, 2024, was a significant

event. The assembly theme, "Cultivating Love," marked the beginning of a year-long theme emphasis for the entire synod; a testament to our shared values and mission.

At the assembly, we were privileged to hear from writer and pastor Rev. Jeff Chu, our ELCA Churchwide Organization representative, Rev. Sara Cutter, and the

report of the Bishop from Bishop Scott Johnson. Led in worship by the musical leadership of Dr. John Weit from the ELCA Churchwide Organization, we all participated in several workshop

opportunities, worship, and the important business of the synod. It was a collective experience that strengthened our bonds and deepened our understanding of our faith.

So, what is cultivation? In terms of farming, cultivation involves preparing for growth and tending as plants begin to grow.

I loved this image of cultivation; the land is constantly being worked and reworked to produce a crop. If you have a fertile field, you have to tend to that field over and over. Herbicides,

pesticides, and fertilizers are just a few additives to help keep that field fertile. If you are a dryland farmer, you are at the mercy of Mother Nature to provide life-giving rain at the right time. Farming is not for the faint of heart; there are a lot of variables that are out of our control. Not enough rain, too much rain, commodity prices, cost of repairs, etc., the list can get pretty lengthy.

The parable of the sower was one of the stories I wanted to share. "The sower goes out, and as he sowed, some seeds fell along the path, and the birds came and devoured them. Other seeds fell on rocky ground, where they had little soil, and immediately they sprang up since they had no depth of soil, but when the sun rose, they were scorched, and since they had no



root, they withered away. Other seeds fell upon thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked them. Other seeds fell on good soil and brought forth grain." (Matthew 13:1)

How many of us were brought up to believe that if we weren't producing good fruit, we weren't being Christians? I have always struggled with this question. What is good fruit? Just because the banana is green today doesn't mean it won't be ready in a couple of days. Conversely, if the banana goes brown, it doesn't mean it cannot be used to make something delicious.

Reflect on this for a moment. God is THE creator of everything in this universe, so why would God let anything go

to waste? The bird eats the seed and finds nourishment. Equally, that same bird will digest that seed and dispose of it somewhere else; who are we to say it doesn't end up in good soil somewhere else?

What about the seed that falls within the thorns? Yes, that seed will grow and die, but within its cycle of life and death, it will decompose and begin regenerating topsoil. This theme repeats itself in our own lives: living, dying, and regeneration. We are Easter people, after all; this is what Martin Luther meant when we said we must go through Good Friday to arise on Easter Morning.

God comes to provide us with all the nutrients so we remain good soil. Just like the farmer, we need to tend to our fields. The fertilizer, herbicides, and pesticides differ slightly in our faith life. I would say spending time in scripture, attending worship regularly, volunteering for service projects, answering calls when our neighbors have needs, and learning to trust that God is providing everything.

Every field requires care and attention, just like our faith life. The novice farmer doesn't have the same experience(s) as the veteran farmer, but that doesn't mean their capabilities are substandard; they only lack time. They will gain experience as they work in their fields, tend to the issues when they arise, and seek advice and counsel from those with knowledge.

Nothing goes to waste; God will use everything you have to grow the harvest of believers. Jesus never said our faith life would be easy, but Jesus said, "This is the work of God, that you believe in him whom God has sent" (John 6:29). "Therefore, my beloved, be steadfast, immovable, always excelling in the work of the Lord, because you know that in the Lord your labor is not in vain. (1 Cor. 15:58)

Let us cultivate love in our fields of faith, trusting our savior has plowed a path in front of us. Let us continue to join the pioneers of our faith, spreading the seeds of faith, hope, and love while praying for good nourishment to help those seeds grow and flourish. When the day comes, let us participate in the harvest by proclaiming the Good News of Jesus Christ.


