FROM OUR PASTOR...

"LOVE AND TIME"

Grace, mercy, and peace from our Creator God and Lord Jesus Christ.

want to start with a short story about the relationship between love and time. I don't recall where I came across this story, but it speaks to my heart as they work together, yoked through the fabric of creation. This speaks to the outpouring of what God has done and continues to do: to bless us with grace upon grace.

Once upon a time, there was a secluded island where all the feelings lived: Happiness, Sadness, Anger, Trust, the rest of the feelings, and all the accompanying emotions, including Love and Time. As long as they lived, everyone in the world could have them.

But then, one day, it was announced that the island was going to sink, so they all had to vacate the island as soon as possible or die, and with their deaths, everyone in the world would lose those feelings forever. All the feelings and company quickly prepared their boats to leave as soon as possible. Love was the only one who decided to stay until the island started to sink.

But when the moment came, and Love wanted to leave, Love found itself without a boat. Someone else must have taken it. Love started to worry... and then suddenly, it saw Wealth. As Wealth passed by in its most beautiful boat, Love said, "Wealth, can you take me with you?" Wealth answered, "No, I can't. There is a lot of gold and silver in my boat, and sadly, there is no place here for you."

PRAYER ime

Why do we pray?

God is ever present in our lives whether we notice it or not. We make time to pray in order to notice God's presence. Unless we make that decision to spend time in prayer with God, days can go by without so much as a "thank you" to God for all the blessings we receive every day.

Prayer, then, is the conscious act of placing ourselves in God's presence, both speaking and listening for God. Prayer is meant to be a dialog with God. We must use words, but also spend time in silence.

Many people find it much easier to pray for someone else who is suffering, in pain, sick, or grieving than to pray for ourselves. When we do take time to pray for ourselves, it is usually when we feel down, ill, or in pain. It is really okay to pray for ourselves anytime! Praying for ourselves deepens our relationship with God. It keeps us in tune with our feelings and emotions. We also become more aware of God's presence in the ordinary events of our lives. We begin to see Christ in others and in all of creation.

One way to pray for ourselves is to use **Breath Prayers**. Here are the guidelines for you to try and hopefully practice until it becomes a habit or a favorite way to pray.

- Find a quiet spot.
- Sit comfortably with your feet on the floor and your arms in your lap or by your side.
- Use Breath Prayers as you sit down at a table or your desk, as you get into your car before turning it on, as you reach your destination before getting out of the car, as you are getting into or out of bed.
- Close your eyes or soften your gaze.
- Choose a phrase that is meaningful to you. It can be a verse from the Bible or a line from a favorite hymn, or the line from a poem.
- As you take in a deep breath, mentally say the first part of the phrase.
- As you breathe out, mentally say the remainder of the phrase.
- Repeat the breath prayer over and over until you feel a sense of peace or relaxation.

Here are several possible breath prayers but feel free to create one of your own:

Breathe in.....

Create in me

Spirit of God

Precious Lord

Be still

Take time each day to recharge and care for yourself. A five or ten minute break specifically for prayer is great to clear your mind or stop the busyness of the day. It's okay to acknowledge when you need rest and renewal. Self-care is essential for maintaining compassion and kindness towards others.
