FROM OUR PASTOR...

ugust 22nd is my four-year ordination anniversary, and November 20th will mark my one-year anniversary at OSLC; time doesn't seem to slow down. At some point over the last month, I had time to reflect on the transitions that have taken place. I resigned from my duties as Regional Manager at Matheson Tri-Gas seven years ago, which closed a twenty-year career and elevated my seminary studies to full-time.

What brought me to this decision is a much larger story, but at the core of the story is God's invitation. I have often said that if God wants me to listen, God will speak through my closest confidant, Sara.

Seminary had been underway for two years. I was working full time traveling and trying my best to be everything else: husband, father, child, friend, and student. I have never been afraid of hard work; it was a work ethic instilled in us boys by our father, but what pushed me over was recognizing that I was working for the wrong kingdom and worshipping a false god.

I poured everything into my work, sacrificing my relationship (s) with my family and our church. I chased a career and money, thinking that if I just climbed the right ladder and achieved the right amount of success, I could check the box that I had succeeded in life. I am here as your pastor, so you may be able to guess there was a different outcome in my life, but it took someone telling me to see the other path that God had laid out for me.

Matthew 14:13 tells the story of the Feeding of the Five Thousand. After a long day of feeding, teaching, healing, and all things ministry-related, Jesus goes to the top of the mountain to pray. According to the story, the boat the disciples were in becomes detached and begins drifting out to sea.

Later that evening, Jesus finds their boat battered by the waves, and as he approaches the boat, he is labeled as a ghost.

Yes, he was walking on water, and who wouldn't be freaked out by someone or something floating on the top of the water walking toward you in the pitch black of night?

Jesus spoke to them, saying, "Take heart, it is I; do not be afraid." Peter answered, "Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water." Jesus said, "Come." As the story goes, Peter gets out of the boat and quickly realizes that the ground underneath his feet feels uncertain, so he panics and cries out to the Lord to save him. Jesus immediately reached out his hand and caught him.

This was the focus of my conversation with Sara; she told me it was time to get out of the boat. It was time to trust that God would place a path beneath my feet through Christ. It was time to stop worshipping false gods and to allow my life experiences and the Holy Spirit to guide my next steps.

I resigned the Friday before Labor Day—a little ironic, I know. I had no clue how we would afford our living expenses, let alone pay for the added school expenses and take care of our kids and their needs. Sara held me tightly and reassured me that God had brought us to this place and that God would see us through it.

PRAYER

BODY PRAYERS

Adding a physical component to our prayers can keep us more grounded and focused on our conversation with God. We are familiar with using our bodies during worship as we stand for specific hymns, prayers, and the reading of the Gospel. We use our bodies as we bow our heads, fold our hands, and close our eyes in prayer. We use our bodies during hymns when we clap our hands or move to the beat of the song. Pastors raise their arms when making offerings to God. Many congregations kneel for communion or use kneelers for prayer.

Traditionally standing during prayer has been used for praise and worship, while kneeling has been an act of confession and humility. Being seated is a posture used to seek guidance, wisdom, or peace. Having open hands during prayer is a gesture to receive from our Lord.

Our bodies are capable of expressing great love for God. When we use our whole body, along with our heart and mind in prayer, we increase the depth of our worship and improve our attentiveness to our prayer.

Here are some ways to use your body in Prayer:

SIX GESTURES OF MORNING PRAYER:

Taken from Out of the Ordinary by Joyce Rupp.

(Pray aloud the underlined sentences.)

- Offering our Creator praise and gratitude: Stretch your arms high and wide above your head. I thank you, God of all, for the gift of another day of life. Touch your fingertips to your forehead. Open my mind to remember your presence. Touch your fingertips to your mouth. Open my mouth to speak your wisdom. Touch your fingertips to your heart. Open my heart to extend your love.
- 2. Intentionally being aware of my spiritual bond with all of creation:

Hold arms out from your sides, a little below shoulder height. Move to the left and to the right with your arms stretching outward toward the cosmos.

Open my whole being to you.

I reach out in compassion to my sisters and brothers throughout the universe.

3. Offering my life to God:

Stretch your arms out straight in front of you, slightly apart, palms up.

I give to you all I am and all I have.

Open my hands to serve you generously.

- Opening to accept what God offers me this day:
 Pull your hands close together and cup them as a container. <u>I open my entire being to receive the gift that you have waiting for me in this new day.</u>
- 5. Remembering to be kind to our planet Earth:
 Bend over, reach down, and touch the floor.
 I touch this planet, Earth, with awe, reverence, and gratitude, promising to care well for her today.
- 6. Awareness of the indwelling presence of God:
 Stand with crossed hands over your heart, and bow forward.
