FROM OUR PASTOR...

f all the denominational traditions, Lutheranism is the only one that dedicates a Sunday to celebrate the legacy of the Reformation.

Faithfulness to the day and the Reformation legacy, however, is not to celebrate the division of the church but to shine the bright light of the gospel and to remind the church that it is constantly being reformed.

Reformation reminds us that God's people have always needed renewal and reforming. The Babylonian exiles looked forward to their return to Jerusalem. Their return would be accompanied by the new hearts that the prophet Jeremiah promised. The teachings of the law would no longer be confined to clay tablets but would be written on the hearts of God's people, a promise that comes true for us in baptism.

The reformation we need, both as the church and as individuals, is due to our sin. In Paul's letter to the Romans, sin is not the list of things we shouldn't have done but did or the accompanying list of things we should have done but didn't. Sin is the great enslaver, that force of evil and death that binds us and keeps us from the life God intends for us, the church, and indeed for all creation. We all need to be freed, Jew and Gentile alike.

While Paul's words in the reading for Reformation Sunday get rather technical with the language of sacrifice, here, for the first time in Romans, Paul specifically ties our justification—our being made right with God—to Christ's death and resurrection. That's the good news that Luther and his Reformation colleagues dusted off and held up for the world to see in all its divine brilliance.

So, our Reformation celebration also points to the need for the daily recovery of that gospel in our lives and the church. Yet another promise finds its fulfillment in the daily remembrance of baptism.

Justification brings to the Christian a certain freedom. But freedom may not mean what you think it means. The freedom in Romans from the great enslaver gets translated in John's gospel to the freedom to live in the Spirit. It's a freedom to participate in the life of God, freedom to experience the unconditional love and grace of God. All of it ultimately means freedom to live not for ourselves but for God and our neighbor.

It's tempting to make the Reformation about the propositional truths that are the great foundation of the Reformation legacy: Christ alone, grace alone, faith alone, scripture alone. While there is much that is useful and helpful in these Reformation principles, it's not principles that we celebrate. It's the gospel itself that we celebrate, the daily dying and rising of the Christian in the waters of baptism, and the ongoing reformation of the church, the people of God, freed from the great enslaver and set free in service to the world.

Celebrating the Reformation is to remember the gospel truth that in Christ's death and resurrection, by the grace and mercy of God, we have become the children who have a permanent place in the Father's household.

STEWARDSHIP CONVERSATIONS

Dear Siblings in Christ, grace to you and peace from our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, amen.

e are in October, which historically has been our Stewardship month, and this October is no exception.

Our shared responsibility in the Stewardship pledge is a testament to our collective commitment. This year, we will be conducting the pledge in a slightly different manner. In the coming days, you will receive a letter in the mail, along with an Estimate of Giving pledge card. We kindly ask you to fill out the card, seal it in the provided envelope, and return it to the church. Remember, this is not just an individual task but a collective commitment that strengthens our community's bond.

We give because God first gave to us, and out of this, love poured over us; we give back to God because each of us has been entrusted with stewarding the care of God's creation. We intentionally will not open your pledge cards because we want this to be a faith-filled and prayerful exercise solely between you and God. Please ask the Holy Spirit to lead and guide your decisions. We want you to trust that God will provide even when it feels like scarcity will overrun our lives.

Your sealed pledge cards will sit at the foot of the altar through the summer of 2025. During this time, we ask you to prayerfully ask God to open our eyes and hearts, to let our hearts be good soil, and to let your generosity pour out like grains of wheat. Your sealed pledge card will be mailed back to you at the end of summer. Upon receiving your pledge card, it would be an ideal time to pray, reflect on your estimated giving, and look for how God showed up and provided.

Your Stewardship team would like to move away from only talking about stewardship once a year to a yearly stewardship campaign focusing on Time, Talent, and Treasure. We all have something to give, and we give because God asks us to give of ourselves. As you read this, think about how you give to the church, monetarily and through your volunteering.

This is just the beginning of many conversations; please work on filling out your estimate of giving and bring it back to church. We will dedicate the entire month of October to this task, and during our annual meeting in November, we will lift up the estimated pledges together.

It was on that evening that Martin Luther nailed his 95 thesis (protests) to the door of the famous Wittenberg Cathedral. That event opened the way for discussion, controversy and profound changes in the life of the Church throughout Europe at the time.

Reading Scriptures Leads Us to Prayer

Reading the Bible is a powerful way to learn and hear God's word. God's word *instructs* us in prayer and *inspires* us to pray. His word gives substance to our prayers as God speaks to us and shows us the truth. God's word gives us faith to pray and answers many of our questions. When we pray with scripture, we are able to take the words God has given us through His Word and pray those words back to him.

I invite you to try any or all of these ways of using scripture in prayer.

MEMORIZING SCRIPTURE allows us to keep God's word in our hearts. We can hear God's voice and His words as we go through each day. Committing a verse to memory allows us to internalize the message and apply it to our lives. It leads to spiritual growth and a deeper understanding of our faith. The goal of memorizing and continuing to recite a verse is that it eventually becomes a prayer.

- 1. Choose a single verse or a few verses that have caught your interest.
- 2. Commit the verse to memory and recall it throughout the day.
- 3. In addition to reciting the verse during your quiet time, you can recite it while sitting at a stop light or while waiting for someone or when lying in bed.
- 4. Often, something will trigger the verse for you during the day and you will get some new insight into its meaning.

PRAYING THE SCRIPTURES helps us focus on praying. It helps us express ourselves and better understand scriptures. Praying the scriptures is one way to glorify God, as Jesus did.

- 1. Read through the whole passage slowly.
- 2. Put the Bible aside and from memory write down words or phrases that stay with you.
- 3. Think about each of the words or phrases. What do the mean? To whom was the word or phrase addressing?
- 4. Think about what this means to you your personal history, your life as it is now, your inner self.
- 5. Consciously gather up your thoughts and turn to God. Tell God what you are thinking about. Feel God's presence in the sharing. What do you want from God? What do you have to give to God?
- 6. You may find yourself staying with one part of the passage that you find most meaningful rather than the whole passage.
- 7. Let the meaning and value of this passage sink into your life.
- 8. Here are some passages you may like to pray:

1 Samuel 3:1-21

Exodus 3:1-12

Genesis 28:10-22



RESPONDING TO GOD'S WORD is a way of reading Scripture that allows the verses' meanings to inspire thoughts that in turn become prayers. It leads us deeper into God's word. We find ourselves slowing down and savoring the passages. This allows the verses to speak to us in new ways.

- 1. Choose any passage in the Bible that beckons you.
- 2. Read the passage. What word, phrase, or sentence stands out to you? Just sit with that word or phrase or sentence for a few minutes.
- 3. Read the passage again and reflect on the word of God. What is that word, phrase, or sentence saying to you and your life right now?
- 4. Read the passage a third time and respond to the word of God. What is God saying to you? What do you desire to say to God? Be aware of any prayer that might rise up within you.
- 5. You may want to take time to journal about your experience.
- 6. Here are some passages to begin with:
